Annual Report on the activities of the Social Inclusion Foundation in BiH (SIF in BiH)

January 1st 2021 – December 31st 2021

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INTRODUCTION

Basic information about the Social Inclusion Foundation in Bosnia and Herzegovina (SIF in BiH)

Social Inclusion Foundation in Bosnia and Herzegovina is a non-political, non-party, independent and non-profit non-governmental organization established by the Decision on establishment number IBHI/FSU u BiH/10, dated 19 January 2010, according the Law on Associations and Foundations of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The Social Inclusion Foundation in Bosnia and Herzegovina was officially registered in the Ministry of Justice of BiH on 28 January 2010.

THE AIM OF THE ANNUAL REPORT

This annual report covers activities in the period from January 1st 2021 to December 31st 2021. Given the non-profit character of the SIF in BiH, and the fact that it is funded solely through project implementation, the purpose of this report is to provide more information on the implementation of activities in the past year, and future (currently planned) activities under the current project implemented by SIF in BiH.

In addition, SIF in BiH continues to provide up-to-date information relevant for the sector of social inclusion through its own official website sif.ba, the webpage of KOMA – the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH at koma.ba, and other channels such as YouTube and other digital platforms and social networks, thus making available to civil society organizations and other stakeholders all the resources they need to strengthen their role in promoting a democratic society in BiH.

PROJECT “BUILD UP FOR SOCIAL INCLUSION ADVOCACY PLATFORM IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA - #BUILDUP4SIAPINBIH – WILL YOU STOP AND LISTEN”

The contract for the project titled "Build up for Social Inclusion Advocacy Platform in Bosnia and Herzegovina - #BuildUp4SIAPinBiH" was signed on October 30, 2018 between the Delegation of the European Union to BiH (DEU) and Social Inclusion Foundation in Bosnia and Herzegovina (SIF in BiH) for the duration of 32 months for implementation of the Action. Financing of the Action of the total value of 476,990.00 EUR comes from the European Union, totalling 429,291.00EUR, and from the UNICEF in BiH, with amount of 47,900.00 EUR. The project was implemented in partnership with the Initiative for Better and Humane Inclusion.

The project implementation has passed without formidable roadblocks regardless of challenges caused by COVID-19 during second and third project year. Ms. Ranka Ninković-Papić, director of SIF in BiH has presented the first interim report to DEU on November 19, 2019, second interim report on November 18, 2020 and final narrative and financial report on July 16, 2021 which was approved and accepted by the donor.

The obligatory co-financing of the project was secured by signing the contract with UNICEF Country Office in BiH on January 16, 2019. Contract expired on December 31, 2020, and SIF in BiH presented the Final Report to UNICEF BiH on January 25, 2021 which was accepted and approved by the donor.

Overall goal of the project was to develop and strengthen the role, capacities and visibility of non-governmental organizations gathered through the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH - KOMA, with the aim of participating in the creation of social public policies and advocating the rights of marginalized groups, as a precondition for a more equitable and more open society that supports the process of European integrations in BiH.

This goal was achieved through four main components:

- 1) Research and analyses of current needs of the marginalized groups in BiH and development of key documents
- 2) Capacity building and strengthening of the cross-sectoral Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH-“KOMA”
- 3) Social inclusion advocacy activities
- 4) Communication activities and increased visibility

The specific objectives of the project have been achieved:

- Improve the access to rights for the marginalized groups through the initiation and drafting of the Social Inclusion Strategies at the Entity and Brčko District levels;

- Increase the capacity, efficiency and visibility of the cross-sectoral Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH-“KOMA”, with engagement advocacy in field of social public policy;
- Encourage the networking, cooperation and communication amongst the CSO’s and related interested actors;
- Increase the knowledge and importance of dedications that EU accession process brings in relation to protection of social rights of the BiH citizens and subsequently strengthen the support of the BiH’s integration process in the EU, in the light of possible candidacy status of BiH on the European path.

All planned activities were realized, divided into groups according to project components:

- Research, preparation, development and publication of two policy papers;
- Development and publication of the Study “Foundation and Guidelines for Developing Social Inclusion Strategies at the Entities and Brčko District levels”;
- Organization of five specialized trainings;
- Social inclusion advocacy activities with the focus on 20-30 advocacy meetings, three round tables and three SWOT/PEST workshops;
- Communication and visibility activities, as well as wider promotion of project through media;
- Creation and promotion of a documentary focusing on the social inclusion of marginalized groups, as well as original campaign song and lyrics;
- Organization of Final project Conference - the "KOMA" Convention.

Development and publication of two policy papers and the Study “Foundation and Guidelines for Developing Social Inclusion Strategies at the Entities and Brčko District levels”

The two policy papers „Towards the European Union – Key Social Inclusion Issues in BiH“ and “Towards the European Union – Recommendations for Improving Social Inclusion in Bosnia and Herzegovina” were prepared, discussed with relevant stakeholders, finalized and published in 2019.

First Policy Paper aimed to define the approach and concept of social inclusion strategies, taking into account the global situation and the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina and, more specifically, the process of accession of BiH to the European Union, which requires developing social inclusion policies. An analysis of core social inclusion issues was focused on identification of several fundamental problems faced by vulnerable groups, a brief

examination of causes and consequences and an overview of public policies (strategies, laws) of importance for social inclusion.

Second Policy Paper contains the analysis of the genesis of the development of social inclusion policies and their role in the overall strategies of the European Union, such as Europe 2020 and towards a sustainable EU 2030. Particular attention was paid to the open method of coordination and its implementation in BiH. For the first time in BiH, in the context of social inclusion, the negative impact of natural disasters is also analysed. Also, special attention was given to the EU recommendations regarding the BiH reforms presented in the European Commission's Opinion on BiH's application for EU membership (29.05.2019).

Preparation of social inclusion strategies for FBiH, RS and BD BiH was advancing as planned regardless of challenges caused by COVID-19, in full collaboration with competent FBiH, RS and BD BiH ministries.

Strong team of policy experts was selected in January 2020, was comprised of Žarko Papić, team leader for development of social inclusion strategies for FBiH, RS and BD BiH, and members of the expert team Maida Fetahagić, Nataša Stevanović, Ljubo Lepir, and Fahrudin Memić, and they have completed three strategies for the period 2021-2027 in a local and English language by December 2020.

Study titled “The Foundation and Guidelines for Developing Social Inclusion Strategies at the Entities and Brčko District level” represents an umbrella title for compilation of three separate social inclusion strategies for the FBiH, RS and BD BiH prepared by policy experts using the harmonized methodology for all.

All three strategies, namely those of the Federation of BiH, the Republika Srpska and the Brčko District of BiH, are harmonised, aimed at addressing the following key issues of social inclusion:

- Social position of children and youth, especially in the context of the demographic decline;
- Poverty and the necessity for reducing it through social inclusion policies
- People with disabilities and the fight for a society of equal opportunities;
- Gender causes of social exclusion;
- Elderly people and a return to a dignified life without poverty;
- Ethnic causes of social exclusion and the importance of full national equality.

The results of the project team lobbying activities for the documents adoption are as follows:

- At its session held on February 18, 2021, the Parliament of the Federation of BiH adopted the Development Strategy of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina proposed by the Government of the Federation of BiH and prepared by the Federation Institute for Development Programming with the participation of a large number of actors, including our project. In this Strategy, Strategic Goal 2: Priority and Inclusive Social Development, Priority 2.5. Reduce poverty and social exclusion, measure 2.5.1. Improving the social inclusion of marginalised groups, the following is stated: "...In the coming period it is necessary to adopt a comprehensive strategic document (Social Inclusion Strategy), which would contain specific policies and programmes targeted at groups of the population who are socially excluded or at risk of poverty and social exclusion... It is necessary to constantly develop public awareness of the significance of social inclusion" (p 51).
- The Government of the Brčko District of BiH adopted the "Development Strategy of the Brčko District of Bosnia and Herzegovina 2021-2027" on October 21, 2020 and the Assembly of the Brčko District of BiH on May 19, 2021. The basics of expertly prepared Social Inclusion Strategy for Brčko District of Bosnia and Herzegovina for 2021-2027 are fully integrated into the Development Strategy of the Brčko District of BiH, which is a great progress compared to the previous strategy of the Brčko District of BiH.
- The work plan of the Government of Republika Srpska for 2018-2022 includes the drafting of "Republika Srpska Strategy for the Development of Social Protection in 2021-2027". In January 2021, the document "Social Inclusion Strategy for Republika Srpska for 2021 -2027" was submitted to the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare with a recommendation to use it in making their strategy.

Organization of five specialized trainings

Five trainings for different participants of the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH "KOMA" were completed in 2019. The trainings were attended by a total of 89 participants.

The thematic areas of the trainings were as follows: Strategic planning and fundraising, How to write a project proposal, Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and social media networks, Advocacy and public relations, What does EU mean to us.

Social inclusion advocacy activities with the focus on 20-30 advocacy meetings, three round tables and three SWOT/PEST workshops

3 round tables were organized in 2019. for a total of 71 participants - international organizations (8), CSOs (39), institutions (17), academic community (2), social enterprises (1) and agencies (4).

During project implementation there was a total of 24 advocacy meetings organized with government officials. Purpose of discussion with all project counterparts was lobbying for institutional support to development of social inclusion strategies. All advocacy meetings were positively concluded with:

The three SWOT/PEST workshops and online consultations were organized for a total of 67 participants - CSOs (34), international organizations (1), institutions (22), agencies (2), academic community (5), individuals (2) and media (1).

Communication and visibility activities, as well as wider promotion of project through media

The project achieved a strong media visibility - far more than originally planned. Realized communication and visibility activities ensured that BiH many citizens received information about the project several times. More precisely, **reported cumulative reach is 6.825.955 million BiH citizens**. Due to strong media campaign performed (with innovative approaches to media and communication tools used) within the project, the interest of media in BiH significantly increased, which generated 73% more media reports (total of 139 media reports). Project team, through the media and communication activities, has continually worked on diverse PR products to raise citizens' knowledge why social inclusion matters and urge decision-makers accelerate reforms.

Project contained the following communication activities:

- Due to the promotion of six events, six media opportunities were organized; six media announcements and six press releases were written and distributed. Each PR was distributed on minimum 50 media;
- TV and radio appearances were organized (4 radio and 9 TV appearances) briefly presented below:
 - Mr Žarko Papić was guest on **BH radio 1** in "Otvoreni studio" on July 08, 2019 and **TV Hayat** in TV show "Dobar dan BiH" on October 17, 2019. He presented and spoke about the first policy paper "Towards the European Union- Key issues of social inclusion in BiH";
 - Ms Ranka Ninković-Papić was a guest in open studio **RTV Vogošća** on October 21, 2019. She presented the project "Will You Stop and Listen" with focus on improving partnership between governmental and non-governmental sector, particularly in terms of social inclusion strategies development in BiH;
 - On October 13, 2020 **TV SA** in its renowned „**Sarajevska špica**“ with Brankica Rudan hosted an interview titled "Social Inclusion in BiH – problems and solutions" with Žarko Papić director of Initiative for Better and Humane Inclusion (IBHI) and Team leader of policy component of "Will You Stop and Listen" project, Fikret Zuko

director of association of blind of Sarajevo Canton and deputy chairman of association of blind of FBiH, and Željko Volaš chairman of the association of amputees „UDAS“ RS from Banja Luka. Guest shared their views with the journalist and elaborated on various reasons why social inclusion strategies are compulsory documents for progress to be achieved in FBiH, RS and BD BiH and impact on candidacy status of BiH for EU membership;

- On October 20, and 21, 2020 (Objective news and interview) Žarko Papić director of Initiative for Better and Humane Inclusion (IBHI) and Team leader of policy component of “Will You Stop and Listen” project was guest on **RTV HIT** from Brčko. Mr. Papić explained what social inclusion by definition is, what is situation in BiH – what groups are marginalized the most, and in that respect, what are the recommendations of the EC from the EC Opinion on BiH candidacy;
- On the December 3, 2020 Ranka Ninković-Papić, SIF in BiH director was guest in the morning show of **BHRT** „Jutro za sve/Morning for everyone“, dedicated to December 3 – International day of persons with disabilities. Aspirations of the project „Will You Stop and Listen“ were commented on as a response to the challenges marginalized groups are facing in the bh society. In this show Ms Ninković-Papić also presented a documentary “Will You Stop and Listen”, filmed and broadcasted within the project that presents life stories of real persons with aim to inspire citizens and political decision makers to engage in finding solutions;
- Ms Ranka Ninković-Papić was a guest on **Radio Konjic** Open Studio on February 18, 2021. She presented the entire project activities of SIF in BiH, with an emphasis on project campaign song/spot as well documentary movie both entitled “Will You Stop and Listen”;
- Ms Ranka Ninković Papić was a guest on **Radio East Sarajevo** on February 26, 2021. She spoke about project achievements and its impact on marginalized groups. She highlighted a different project approach towards media using diverse tools to approach public;
- The thematic appearance was about the meaning and importance of the social inclusion strategies for FBiH, RS and BD BiH for the period 2021-2027., which was created within the project “Will You Stop and Listen”. Guest of the show “Otvoreni program/Open studio” on **TVSA**, on May 1, 2021 was Ms. Ranka Ninković-Papić, director of SIF in BiH;
- On May 25, 2021 Ms Ranka Ninković-Papić, director of the SIF in BiH was a guest on **BH Radio1** in “Otvoreni studio” and spoke about the project results for past 32 months, as well as the final project conference “Will You Stop and Listen” that encompassed all project outputs and products;
- Ms Ninković-Papić was guest on **BHT** on June 23, 2021. Host was Danko Delibašić. She presented the entire project achievements including final project conference. An accent was on path of the KOMA Coalition and its development. Moreover, dialogue was about public perception of marginalized groups, poverty, social inclusion and everyday fight for better and fairer BiH society with equal opportunities and social justice;

- Ms Ranka Ninković-Papić was guest on TV Zenica (central news program "ZenicaInfo"), on June 26, 2021. She spoke about project path for 32 months and its outputs presented in a various forms. She pointed out the importance of adoption of social inclusion strategies in BiH as well inclusive approach throughout the project. In addition, she mentioned the significance of the Coalition of marginalized groups KOMA and public perception change towards marginalized groups.
- **A video spot "Will You Stop and Listen"** was produced in order to announce the work on more active social inclusion and abandonment of the concept of passive social protection, appealing to all segments of society to accept and promote equal opportunities for all citizens. The video "Will You Stop and Listen" is 31 seconds long and carries the universal affirmative message of acceptance of diversity and mutual understanding. Video spot „Will You Stop and Listen“ is broadcasted on public TV broadcasters (BHT, FTV and RTRS) in period August 21, 2019 until September 21, 2019 with 94 broadcasting or 2 914 seconds in the air and TV campaign reached 1 108 009 people. Video spot was published on SIF in BiH YouTube channel on August 20, 2019 and promoted with results of 573,043 impressions and 322,535 views. Promotion of this video spot through Facebook was also very successful. In period from August 22, 2019 until September 19, 2019 video has 1 037 011 impressions, 222 849 views, 1 169 reactions on video.

- Project campaign on social networks (Facebook and YouTube) included the promotion of the video infographic "Will You Stop and Listen-Why social inclusion matters?" (November 2019). Promotion of this video reached 72 695 people with 2 628 engagements in less than a month. It is also made with English subtitles.
- SIF in BiH and IBHI have produced and published 3 PR articles:
 - **"Will You Stop and Listen - together we are stronger"** an interview with Selvedin Dedić, KOMA member from Zenica (The story reached 188 619 people through 4 media outlets newspapers);
 - **"No one should be left out"** (This article consisting of five interviews with experts for the Social Inclusion Strategies reached 601.756 people through 5 media outlets/newspapers and 22.922 people through 9 web portals);
 - **"Fight for a better and fairer BiH society"**, a story about project impact and its achievements (The article reached 383 835 people through 4 media outlets/newspapers and 19 265 people through 9 web portals).

- The First Story in focus is about **Tatjana Kosak**, the president of the association "Utjeha" **from Široki Brijeg**, a member of the Coalition of marginalized groups in BiH "KOMA", a single mother of two children and a person with disability. Her story (03:01 minutes long) was produced and posted on SIF in BiH YouTube channel and promoted through SIF in BiH Facebook page on October 8, 2019 and had 3 520 engagements. This story reached 140 951 people via Facebook campaign.

- The Second Story in focus is about **Nebojša Kolak**, an activist **from Trebinje**, a member of the Coalition of marginalized groups in BiH “KOMA”, a journalist, a civilian casualty, a disabled person and soon a law graduate. His story (03:01 minutes long) was produced and posted on SIF in BiH YouTube channel with 3 513 views and promoted through SIF in BiH Facebook page on October 22, 2019 and reached 57 232 people via Facebook.

- The Third Story in focus is about **Aida Šahmanović**, Bachelor of Economics **from Sarajevo**, a member of the Coalition of marginalized groups in BiH "KOMA", a proud mother of twins with autism. Aida spoke about parent’s love as a fuel needed for battle with public unawareness, stigma and intolerance, and bureaucratic hurdles for persons with disabilities. Story in focus with Aida Šahmanović (03:01 minutes long) was promoted on January 17, 2020 on SIF in BiH Facebook and SIF in BiH YouTube with 19 200 views. This story has also been produced with English subtitles and promoted on social networks. This promotion had 423 500 impressions on YouTube and reached 102 083 people via Facebook.

- The fourth Story in focus is about the Association of cancer survivors **“Sutra je novi dan/Tomorrow is a new day” from Velika Kladuša**. The Association is named in memory of Donna Ares, whose songs convey the message to those in illness that tomorrow is a new day and they should never give up from fighting. This story in focus (03:29 minutes long) was promoted on September 10, 2020 on SIF in BiH YouTube with 19 200 views and 149 300 impressions and on SIF in BiH Facebook story had 4 740 engagements and reached 130 640 people.

- The fifth Story in focus is the story about **"Patriot" from Bijeljina**, company that employs persons with disabilities, which has been operating successfully for the past 20 years, employs 31 people and thus proves that persons with disabilities have the knowledge, skills and will to actively participate in the labour market and contribute to building a better BiH society. Employment of persons with disabilities is one of the basic conditions for ensuring social inclusion.

This story in focus (04:16 minutes long) was produced and published on April 26, 2021 on SIF in BiH YouTube Channel (2115 engagements and 1019 views) and SIF in BiH Facebook where promotion reached 63 787 people.

- **First video Compilation "Will You Stop and Listen"** is a compilation of previous art works, that are: video "Will You Stop and Listen" and stories in focus with Tatjana Kosak (chairman of the Association of citizens, parents, friends, persons with disabilities and additional needs "Utjeha" (Comfort) from Široki Brijeg), Aida Šahmanović (economist from Sarajevo and mother of twins with autism), Nebojša Kolak (civil war victim from Trebinje) and members of the Association of cancer survivors "Sutra je novi dan" from Velika Kladuša. - **Second compilation "Will You Stop and Listen"** includes video stories created within the project, precisely video fragments from: "Why Social Inclusion Is Important", a trailer for the documentary "Will You Stop and Listen", the video spot "Will You Stop and Listen", as well as stories in focus with Tatjana Kosak, President of the Association "Utjeha"/Comfort/ from Široki Brijeg; Aida Šahmanović, a graduate economist from Sarajevo and mother of twins in the autism spectrum; Nebojša Kolak, a civilian victim of the war from Trebinje; members of the association for help with cancer patients "Sutra je novi dan"/Tomorrow is a new day/ from Velika Kladuša and the company for employment of the disabled "Patriot" from Bijeljina. This Compilation (03:41 minutes long) was published and promoted on May 28, 2021 on SIF in BiH YouTube channel with 79 493 views and reached 152 100 people, and SIF in BiH Facebook page with 253 500 impressions and 27 897 people reached.

As a part of the PR and awareness raising pursuits, **“Will You Stop and Listen” documentary film** (51 minutes long) was made with focus on social inclusion of the marginalized groups through a representation in real life characters. Production of the documentary film was finalized by mid-October 2020. A leitmotif of the film is person’s inspiration to reach a goal and move towards that goal unstoppably. Trailer was posted at EUresurs.ba and sif.ba. Trailer was viewed 60 022 on Facebook. Film was promoted live at two locations i.e. in Sarajevo on October 17 in Sarajevo city hall and in Banja Luka on October 23, 2020 in National Theatre of Republika Srpska. Due to COVID-19 safety measures number of invitees was limited in both places (cumulatively 80 persons in the audience), but media coverage was extraordinary. All media reported that film “Will You Stop and Listen” glows with optimisms and affirmation of one’s willpower, celebrating toughness of spirit, and beauty of human being.



For the purpose of movie promotion there was prepared the following: 1 version of documentary movie with BCS subtitles for visually impaired persons; 1 version of documentary movie with subtitles in English; 1 version of documentary movie with subtitles in English for visually impaired persons; two trailers (duration 01:13 minutes and duration 0:50 seconds) and seven teasers (Will You Stop and Listen teaser and teasers for every actor in the movie - Azra Dedić from Bihać, Nadina Imamović from Sarajevo, Biljana Nedić, Haris Eminović and Vanja Čolić from Banja Luka and Kristijana Nikolić from Mostar).

SIF in BiH and IBHI documentary film “Will You Stop and Listen” that was broadcasted at the official YouTube channel on November 26, 2020 has been viewed a 6.445 times (6.445 views) with 58,400 impressions. It was posted on Facebook at the same time, and received 308 likes, 38 shares, with reach of 90.287 and 3.534 engagements.

In addition, the movie "Will You Stop and Listen" was broadcasted on 10 TV stations in BiH, including 3 public broadcasters (RTRS, BHT 1 and FTV), and 7 local TV stations (TV Visoko, TV Bugojno, TV Goražde, TV TK, ELTA HD, RTV Vogošća i TV USK) and had its rerun four times, which is 14 movie broadcasts in total, or more precisely 42,896 seconds on the air. TV promotion reached 483.704 people. All the broadcastings are agreed with TV stations free of charge.

Creation of “Will You Stop and Listen” campaign song lyrics and production of campaign song with original music were completed by October, 2020. The lyrics refer to vulnerable population. Author sees them as colours, and uses project’s motto “Will You Stop and Listen” (*Zastani i poslušaj*) as a refrain, with heartfelt message to people who close their eyes

and turn their backs to marginalized groups to embrace all.

Spot for the song was published on SIF in BiH YouTube channel on January 25, 2021 where reached 537 people, on official SIF in BiH web page and was promoted on SIF in BiH Facebook with 582 engagements. This song was distributed on 141 radio stations in BiH and 8 radio stations premiered the song (Radio Vitez, Radio Konjic, Radio Donji Vakuf, Radio Olovo, Radio Gradačac, Radio Ilijaš, Radio Kiss FM Sarajevo i Radio Istočno Sarajevo). In addition, PR articles about song/spot and “Will You Stop and Listen” project was published on 4 portals radiovitez.ba, radiodonjivakuf.com.ba, radio.olovo.ba, radioilijas.ba.

In line with the Law on Copyright and Related Rights (Official Gazette of BiH, no. 63/10), to protect its work from unauthorised replication and use, SIF in BiH has registered a campaign song and a documentary film “Will You Stop and Listen” with the Institute for Intellectual Property of BiH in the records of copyright works and subject matters of related right.

- Besides continuous media promotion (portals, newspapers, radio and TV stations), Social media and SIF in BiH web page, promotion was continuous on the EURESURS, a hub for information and promotion of CSO-led actions. Statistics at EURESURS page show that the subpage “Will You Stop and Listen” was visited by 1,8% of total of visitors of euresurs.ba page. During the project SIF in BiH uploaded 35 news in local and English language totaling. Also, Publication section contained 13 SIF in BiH documents, 10 documents in two languages BCS and English and 3 documents in English.

Organization of Final project Conference - the "KOMA" Convention

Due to the circumstances caused by the coronavirus pandemic, the Final Conference of the project was organised in Sarajevo as a combined, hybrid event at the International Centre for Children and Youth Novo Sarajevo (Youth Centre Grbavica) on May 25, 2021. Some of the participants attended the Conference via the Zoom platform and some attended the programme directly in the hall of the Grbavica Youth Centre. The event was attended by a total of **63 representatives** of civil society organisations dealing with the problems of marginalised groups in Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH), government institutions and academic community, out of which 40 attended it online and 23 in the hall. On that occasion, SIF in BiH

and the IBHI presented the most significant achievements of the two and a half years of their operation. Among them are three modern Social Inclusion strategies, expertly prepared for the Federation of BiH, Republika Srpska and the Brčko District of BiH for the period 2021-2027 and harmonised with European Union standards. In addition to the strategies, the final project conference presented both the video for the campaign song “Will You Stop and Listen!” and the compilation with the same name, which integrates the project videos and which helped to present to the BiH public and beyond the position and role of marginalised groups in the development of social policies for a society of equal opportunities in BiH.

A general conclusion and opinion of the participants at the conference of the Project “Will You Stop and Listen” is that the project “Build up for Social Inclusion Advocacy Platform in Bosnia and Herzegovina - Will You Stop and Listen” has, with the support of the European Union and UNICEF, contributed towards more progressive steps of BiH to the European Union.

A text “Strategies of social inclusion - the significance and role” was prepared for the conference, which was an introduction for the discussion (Available at the following link: https://sif.ba/Documents/Publikacije/2021/SIS_significance_and_role_en.pdf).

- **Membership in the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH “KOMA”** has been increased to 121 members (List of active members is available at https://koma.ba/bos/Clanice/Clanice_koalicije_KOMA)
- During the project implementation, SIF in BiH conducted **18 public procurement procedures**, in accordance with the rules of the Contract signed with the Delegation of the European Union in BiH.



PROJECT “BUILDING CAPACITIES OF CSOs TO ACTIVELY ADVOCATE FOR THE ROLE OF MARGINALIZED GROUPS IN THE PROCESS OF EU ACCESSION”

The project “Building Capacities of CSOs to Actively Advocate for the role of Marginalized Groups in the process of EU accession” had a budget of 47,130.00 EUR in total with duration of seven months starting as of October 1, 2020 and ending on April 30, 2021.

Project was implemented with the support of the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Ms. Ranka Ninković-Papić, director of SIF in BiH has presented the final narrative and financial report on May 28, 2021.

The project objectives and its expected results have been completely achieved:

Project objective 1: Increase the engagement of CSOs representing the marginalized groups and improve the understanding on the strength and value of their role in the EU accession process.

Expected project outcome 1: Ensured dialogue mechanisms for marginalized and vulnerable citizens and groups that enable EU accession process in BiH through fostered mutual trust, support and shared common values;

Project objective 2: Strengthen advocacy skills for the selected CSO representatives with the goal of enabling them to participate in and influence public policy in the field of social development and rights in the light of EU accession.

Expected project outcome 2: Empowered civil society organizations representing marginalized groups in BiH to promote, address and advocate for the civic, participatory and inclusive EU accession process.

Project objective 3: Foster networking and cooperation among civil society organizations representing marginalized groups in Bosnia and Herzegovina from both entities and Brčko District, interchangeably, to advance common goals and advocate for the role of marginalized groups in EU accession process.

Expected project outcome 3: Improved perceptions towards diversity and coexistence as well as increased awareness of the civil society organizations representing marginalized groups in BiH on the importance of their role in the EU accession process.

The overall project aim was to develop capacities of CSOs to participate in policy making and represent marginalized groups in order to promote CSO awareness of a responsibility to publicly represent marginalized groups and interact with State actors to advocate for policies that serve these groups, particularly in the context of EU accession.

The project also included integrated communication effort, combining a story-telling video, info-graphics, a large-scale Convention of the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH – KOMA, social media campaign in order to communicate the importance of a bottom-up approach in creating a social movement by gathering vulnerable and marginalized individuals and groups to advocate for inclusive EU accession process in BiH and fulfilling the Chapter 19.

All previously planned project activities, were realized as follows:

Preparatory phase

- Internal logistical preparations for project implementation have been completed;
- A detailed Action plan for the project implementation has been prepared;
- PR support and social media campaign – PR Expertise and Consultancy support selected;
- Project motto "Make it louder" ("Glas do daske" in local language) created and Poster in B/H/S and English designed and produced;
- Project-branded Leaflet was completed in time. The project motto "Make It Louder" and selected text and design were educational and inviting. The key message was about the importance of the bh civil society organizations' (CSOs) role in advocacy towards fulfilment of requirements for membership of BiH in the European Union. 500 pieces were printed and distributed to various audiences.

Research of thematic areas for project trainings among CSOs representing marginalized

SIF in BiH has performed a training needs assessment among members of Coalition "KOMA" in November 2020, and has selected method for determining if a training need exists and, if it does, what training is required to fill the gap under the Training component of the project. Training needs assessment has helped SIF in BiH to identify accurately the levels of the actual situation in the targeted survey and assess the gap between the actual capability of the participants and desired status of skills and competencies among "KOMA" members. The assessment process was also helped the trainers to specify the training need or performance deficiency prior to formalizing a training agenda.

A research report was prepared.

Trainings

First training **“Targeted communication and building advocacy plans”** was held on December 8 and 9, 2020 in Sarajevo (Hotel Grand). The goal of the training was informing and educating representatives of the NGO sector in BiH dealing with matters of marginalized groups - on importance and tools of creating and implementing advocacy campaigns. Representatives of 17 citizens' associations across BiH participated in training. During training, participants learnt about tools for planning and implementing various lobbying interventions that will contribute to fulfilment of standards in Chapter 19 “Social policy and employment” of the negotiation process for BiH accession to European Union. Trainer Brankica Rudan moderated the thematic block "How to communicate with the media", trainer Merima Spahić presented to the participants the ways of advocating and using the external communications in the advocacy process and trainer Edin Spahić explained the importance of visual identity of publications in social media, devising an effective campaign slogan, graphic editing and design of all media announcements and accompanying promotional materials of the campaign.

Media: Fena, Vijesti.ba and Bosanski.com published an article about the event.

Second training **“How to use social networks for digital advocacy”** was held on February 1 and 2, 2021 in Sarajevo (Hotel Holiday). The aim of training was to inform and educate representatives of the NGO sector in BiH dealing with matters of marginalized groups - on importance of using social networks and implementing digital advocacy campaigns. Representatives of 19 citizens' associations across BiH participated in training. Throughout training participants learnt about important skills for using digital media to improve their social and economic integration in communities. Trainer Edin Spahić moderated the thematic block “Importance of the visual identity of the organisation, project and campaign”, trainer Muamer Sijerčić presented the thematic block “Why and how to be present on social networks” and trainer Merima Spahić explained the importance of communication and campaigning on social networks.

Audio content has been recorded for blind persons who participated in the training.

Media: Nezavisne.com and Bijeljina.online published an article about the event.

A story-telling video

The representatives of the marginalized groups were engaged in the preparation of a 9-minute video “Make it louder” and collaborated in the planning and concept development. After a detailed, inclusive approach to research and identification of interlocutors, four different representatives of the marginalized groups were selected to act in the video filmed in the following cities across BiH: Suada Harčević, Association of women for sustainable development “Vakat” Jezerski, Bosanska Krupa; Nihad Kadić, Association for helping people with mental disabilities "Together we are stronger", Gračanica; Dejan Grgić, Association of

youth with disabilities "InfoPart" Banja Luka and Nasija Džihanović, Association for helping patients with cancer "Tomorrow is a new day", Velika Kladuša.

The video has been recorded at the original locations where representatives of the marginalized people live and work in their everyday environment (NGO's, at home, on the street, with friends...)

Filming/shooting and editing film and trailer was done with easy read subtitles. This story-telling video has also been produced with English subtitles.

The short trailer "Make it louder" has been released on SIF in BiH YouTube and Facebook page on March 17, 2021, and story-telling video was posted on social media (SIF in BiH Facebook and YouTube) on March 18, 2021. The video was also broadcasted on RTV Jablanica and TV USK on April 15 and 16, 2021.

Info-graphics

Six (6) infographics was designed on the social rights in the light of EU accession process, enriched by high quality, piercing imagery - photos and graphic solutions, and was published once a month throughout the project implementation with the goal of information and activation of public about the significance of a particular problem, as follows:

- Conditions for BiH to enter the European Union on January 6, 2021
- Social policy and employment of rural women on January 29, 2021
- Social inclusion of the youth with disabilities on February 10, 2021
- Social inclusion and protection of marginalized persons on February 20, 2021
- Health and social protection on March 10, 2021
- Gender equality in employment and on labour market on April 8th 2021

All infographics has received high public interest during the promotion on social networks (SIF in BiH and KOMA Facebook pages).

Round tables

First Round table "Enforcement of the Action plan for the implementation of Declaration of marginalized groups in BiH" was organized and held on December 17, 2020 in Sarajevo (hotel Holiday). Moderator of the round table was Žarko Papić. 18 representatives of institutions and CSOs dealing with problems of marginalized groups in BiH actively debated and contributed in making the conclusions of the round table. There has been given and adopted several valuable suggestions and inputs for the execution of the Action plan for the implementation of Declaration of marginalized groups in BiH in light of EU accession process.

The round table attracted numerous attention from media houses and the conclusions were reported by: Fokus, Glas Krajine, Radio Sarajevo, Fena, Source, Start Magazine and RTV Slon.

Second round table "Enforcement of the Action plan for the implementation of Declaration of marginalized groups in BiH" was organized and held in Banja Luka on February 24th 2021 (hotel Courtyard by Marriott). Moderator of the round table was Žarko Papić. 23 representatives of institutions/CSOs dealing with the problems of marginalized groups in BiH, international and academic community actively debated and contributed in making the conclusions of the round table. The aim was to advance marginalized groups role in solving social and economic problems by participating in advocacy process for legislation changes concerning their poor current state in accordance with the recommendations of the European Commission. On this occasion, SIF in BiH has also presented the "Toolkit webinar" as a tool for marginalized groups in BiH on advocacy educational activities.

This event also aroused great media interest, and it was covered by: BHT1, BH Radio 1, Slobodna Bosna, Beta.ba and Ljepota i zdravlje.



Round tables held in Sarajevo and Banja Luka

Toolkit-webinar on advocacy

Toolkit-webinar on advocacy (6:44 minute long video and 6 static graphics on “How to”) was finalized and published on SIF in BiH web site on February 25, 2021.

This tool is available for the beneficiaries to use it continually. It is about audio-visual guidelines aiming to successfully create the advocacy campaign with use of available communication tools. Namely, toolkit video is interactive tool to better understanding of the advocacy process intended for civil society organizations representing marginalized groups in BiH in order to help them with design and advocacy activities promotion. Web toolkit is entirely adapted for use by persons with disabilities (with subtitles and vocal guidelines).

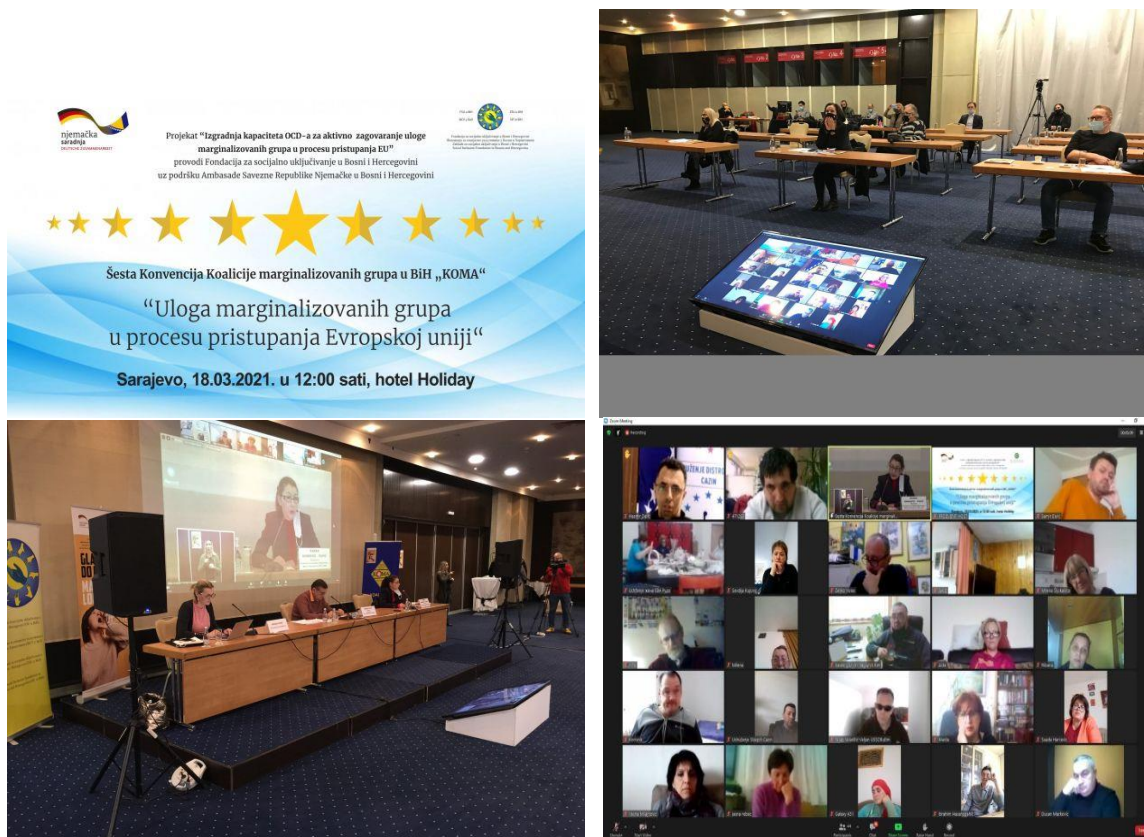

Convention of the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH - KOMA

The sixth KOMA Convention was held on March 18, 2021 in Sarajevo (hotel Holiday). Moderator of the Convention was Žarko Papić. Due to the circumstances caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Convention was organized as a combined event - some of the participants attended this event online, and some of the participants at the "Holiday" hotel in Sarajevo. The convention was attended by **68 participants** from whole BiH, 47 participants online and 21 participants were at the hotel Conference room. On the basis of three collected offers for IT/Zoom Expertise and support, the Agency “Proevent” has been selected as the most favourable and as the best quality bid. Several key conclusions arisen at the Convention of the Coalition of Marginalized Groups in BiH – KOMA. The coronavirus pandemic has extremely worsened the social situation in BiH. The most vulnerable are people with disabilities and other marginalized groups – especially the access to health services has become more difficult. General poverty has also increased.

On the sixth KOMA Convention SIF in BiH has also presented the Story-telling video “Make it louder”, Toolkit-webinar on advocacy, animated video for Social media campaign for enforcement of the Action plan for the implementation of the goals of the Declaration of Marginalized Groups in BiH and six project info-graphics. All project products are specially adapted and adjusted for the combined event.

The KOMA Convention attracted attention from media houses, it was covered by: TV SA, Fena, Nezavisne newspaper, Peacebuilding Network, Senzor, Hayat and BH Radio 1.

PR support and social media campaign

Social media activities, in particular on the SIF in BiH Facebook page and YouTube channel was entailed promotion of all project activities and events. The social media campaign was focused on increasing public awareness about the role of the marginalized groups in EU accession process in BiH while, at the same time, inspire wider audiences to target for more inclusive processes.

PR experts provided media monitoring of all project activities in cooperation with SIF in BiH, as well as media coverage of all project events.

Animated video (3 minutes long) and five static graphics for promotion of the Action plan on social media was created, designed and produced in order to continue promotion of the Action plan for the implementation of the Declaration of Marginalized Groups in BiH. Video and its static graphics are based on the content of the project materials „Make it louder!”. The goal of this campaign and the way of communication was to explain to the public why marginalized groups are important in the process of EU accession, what are their major problems, and what they could contribute to accession process to the European Union.

Audio-visual material for Social media campaign for enforcement of the Action plan for the implementation of the goals of the Declaration of Marginalized Groups in BiH was promoted during the sixth KOMA Convention held on March 18, 2021 and until the end of the project implementation on social networks (Facebook, YouTube) and SIF in BiH web site.

OTHER IMPLEMENTED, CURRENT AND FUTURE SIF IN BiH ACTIVITIES

SIF in BiH support to the implementation of the IBHI project "Additional financing of the project support for the preparation of the Social Inclusion Strategies in BiH"

In the period May 1, 2021 until October 31, 2021 IBHI implemented a project "Additional financing of the project support for the preparation of the Social Inclusion Strategies in BiH", supported by the OSF BiH. Project was designed to support the most important activities of the "Build up for Social Inclusion Advocacy Platform in Bosnia and Herzegovina in BiH- Will You Stop and Listen" project, implemented by SIF in BiH and IBHI, with the support of the European Union in BiH and UNICEF.

Mr. Žarko Papić, director of IBHI has presented the final narrative and financial report for the project implementation and realized activities in cooperation with SIF in BiH on November 18, 2021 which was approved and accepted by the donor (OSF BiH).

The project was focused on the following activities, which were entirely implemented:

- Activities for the adoption and implementation of Social Inclusion strategies at the Entities and Brčko District of BiH levels;
- Participation of marginalized groups in BiH in advocating for the adoption of Social Inclusion strategies;
- Social inclusion advocacy activities, media and PR campaign in light of the future accession process of BiH to the European Union.

Advocacy activities for the adoption and implementation of Social Inclusion strategies at the Entities and Brčko District of BiH levels, in addition to advocacy meetings and other activities

presented in the section completed projects - "Build up for Social Inclusion Advocacy Platform in Bosnia and Herzegovina in BiH- Will You Stop and Listen", were continued as follows:

- Conference "Social entrepreneurship and its importance for vulnerable groups" (UNICEF, USAID, Association of Social Workers from Federation of BiH) was held in period September 30 until October 01, 2021.
Mr. Žarko Papić, director of IBHI, moderated thematic block "Social entrepreneurship as innovative model for employment of the most vulnerable groups";
- At the conference "Sustainable Development Week in BiH - Importance of social protection in the context of Sustainable Development Goals in BiH" (UNDP) held on October 4, 2021, Žarko Papić was the keynote speaker at the panel discussion "Importance of social protection in the context of Sustainable Development Goals in BiH".

In order to involve marginalized groups in BiH in advocating process for the adoption of Social Inclusion strategies at the Entities and Brčko District of BiH levels, Focus Group "Sustainable Development and Social Inclusion" was organized and finished by the October 12, 2021.

Due to the circumstances caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Focus group was organized as a combined event – online and through zoom conversations.

15 participants, representatives of marginalized groups in BiH and experts received the invitation, of which 6 (2M / 4F) answered online and three (3) through Zoom interviews.

Along with the invitation, the participants have received a document "A Partnership for Sustainable Development: Bosnia and Herzegovina and the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework 2021-2025" (UN BiH and Council of Ministers of BiH), short introduction IBHI document "Key challenges of the Sustainable Development in BiH" and three basic questions:

1. The importance of social inclusion for achieving Sustainable Development Goals.
2. Social Exclusion Index in BiH (2018) shows that 49.4% of the population was socially excluded by at least one of the following factors: living standard, health care, education, participation in the community, freedom of choice, access to services (telephone, internet). Which of the following areas has the greatest negative impact on social exclusion?
3. Social Inclusion Strategies of the Federation of BiH, Republika Srpska and Brčko District of BiH for the 2021-2027. can be used as a tool for sustainable development in BiH.
Your suggestions to the institutions for the realization of this possibility?

The common conclusion on the key importance of social inclusion for sustainable development, the multidimensionality of social exclusion, and the importance of Social

Inclusion Strategies, confirmed the unique interest of marginalized groups in BiH and their understanding of social problems.

Highly emphasized media promotion and visibility of marginalized groups, in addition to the activities presented in the section completed projects - "Build up for Social Inclusion Advocacy Platform in Bosnia and Herzegovina in BiH- Will You Stop and Listen", was continued as follows:

SIF in BiH and IBHI documentary movie "Will You Stop and Listen" officially opened the jubilee, 10th edition of the International Film Festival "Catch the film" Banja Luka, held on October 19, 2021. in the Museum of Contemporary Art of the Republika Srpska.

Festival "Catch the film" in Banja Luka was organized by the humanitarian organization "Partner". Since 2003, this festival has been held in Novi Sad, Kotor and Rijeka also, with many accompanying activities. The goals of the festival are as follows: Informing the public about the life, activities, rights and achievements of people with disabilities; Influencing changes in people's attitudes towards people with disabilities; Better understanding and acceptance of diversity and creating conditions for visibility and inclusion of persons with disabilities in every field of social life.

After the ceremonial premiere, SIF in BiH has received a gratitude letter from the International Film Festival "Catch the Film" Banja Luka for contribution and raising public awareness about people with disabilities.
